## The Busy Beast Parent/Caregiver Discussion Questions

- 1. Who or what sets the pace of life in your household? Does the current pace feel right to you? Why or why not?
- 2. How do your children's schedules compare to yours when you were their age?
- 3. In the book, the Busy Beast says, "You must work hard! Play's a treat you earn" and a child replies, "You are mistaken. Play is HOW we learn." How do you see the relationship between work and play in childhood?
- 4. The children in the book believe the grown-ups have accepted the Beast, that busyness is just a part of life. Do you think that's the case in your community?
- 5. Do you currently see your child's school as an ally or adversary in your relationship with busyness? What policies do they have that support or challenge The Busy Beast?
- 6. There is a line in the book that alludes to the William Butler Yeats quote, "Education is not the filling of a pail, but the lighting of a fire." What activities do your children do in or out of school that seem to "light them up"?
- 7. Many organized programs for children create a strain on families because they can be expensive and take away from family time. Brainstorm some free or nearly-free activities you do (or could do) as a family or with friends.
